The prophet's message

to the community of Judah, struggling to re-establish itself after its years of exile, contains a bright vision of hope. Their scattered children will return, their hearts will be radiantly glad.


Lively images of light, abundance, comfort and prosperity assured a despairing people that their God had not abandoned them to the cruelties of international power politics. Rather, the poetry spoke of the restored community as a centre that would gather the best and brightest of the nations.

The early church and Christian tradition saw in these words a poetic reflection of the radiant joy that accompanies the incarnation of God's light to the world in Jesus Christ. Even today, we believe that God-with-us, Emmanuel, brings light to the darkness of despair, whether that be of a people battered by war or a heart beaten down by depression.

Like dawn light, God's glory has risen upon us.
