When our children were much younger,



There in the middle is that walk through the dark, shadow-filled valley of death. But, ironically, that's life. Can't go around it, under it or over it... gotta go through it. By God's grace (staff, rod, loving presence, resurrection power...) we can go through it. That's life too. Thank God.
