FROM THE SESSION MEETING - April 20, 2016

- Steve Baldry opened the meeting with a reflection on James 3 with emphasis on encouraging everyone to be made to feel welcome here.
- The ad hoc committee on Knox College Fundraising reported that as we are currently soliciting grant money and have drawn money from the Trust Funds, we are not in a positon to directly support the fundraising at this time. We will revisit the request in a year.
- The Congregational Life Committee will organize both the Anniversary Sunday and farewell to Chris Teeuwsen
- It was agreed that Amnesty International be permitted to have a letter writing campaign in December.
- The Faith Formation Committee reported that Dee Lynch has agreed to join the Faith Formation Committee Irene Duffey will attend a presentation on April 24th to hear Rev. Dr. Murray Lawson, president of Scripture Union Canada who will share information about the focus on reaching children 4-14 years of age.
- It was reported that 127 participated in the Good Friday Communion Service. The service was well received.
- Steve Baldry reported on:

The ongoing process in seeking grant funding to supplement the ministry at MacNab.

Update on first weeks of Gathering (9am Sundays)

The 3rd week of July is the possible date for Vacation Bible School Thanks was extended to Ken Hopkins and his team for the excellent tour of the buildings-an amazing turnout

The Good Friday hike was attended by approximately 25–hopefully a new tradition at MacNab

May long weekend Breakfast Outreach progress

Concern for a concentrated effort on Deacon/Elder Pastoral care at MacNab in light of increasing attendance

The Mission Committee reported that Knox Church, Waterdown has been matched with a specific Syrian Refugee family. Father age 45, (construction worker), mother age 31, twin girls age 7, and two boys ages 6 and 3. Knox is hopeful that the family will arrive in June. The MacNab congregation will be kept informed as needs develop The Mission budget for 2016 is now \$8,448 thanks to the Easter Offerings of \$2507.50 and March and April weekly donations totalling \$799.00.

- The Property & Maintenance Committee will proceed to install
 windows in the doors leading off the chancel/sanctuary in compliance
 with Leading with Care policy.
 - A spring clean-up of the MacNab storage rooms is planned for May. The fee schedule for use of Church premises was reviewed and some fee increases adopted.
- The Stewardship Committee met twice in April. It was agreed to adopt the "6 Doors to Giving" program recommended by the Stewardship Committee and to empower the Committee to proceed with implementation of the plan.
- The Presbytery of Hamilton will adopt in May the grid stipend increase of \$850 per year of experience up to eight

THE HAMILTON OUT OF THE COLD PROGRAM reports that MacNab ranked 1st and 2nd this past winter season serving 2652 meals over 20 Mondays and 2319 meals over 18 Saturdays November through March.
